Lutheran Social Services of Michigan is celebrating the start of construction of Gateshead Crossing, a 46-unit affordable housing complex for low-income seniors, located at 4950 Gateshead Street (just north of Mack on Detroit's far east side).

Lutheran Social Services received pre-development and construction grants totaling \$5,404,191 from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to construct the 46-unit apartment building. HUD also awarded LSSM \$509,700 for renewable rent subsidies. The building will serve income-eligible seniors on the site of the now-closed Calvary Senior Center.

The 37,000-square-foot two-story elevator building will have 45 one-bedroom units and a two-bedroom manager's unit, as well as a community room, small kitchen/preparation area, lounges, a library/computer room, community laundry room, lobby and office area. Allspach Architecture of Grand Rapids designed the building, which is being constructed by G. Fisher Construction in Farmington.
